Welcome to the online registration process for the **Australia Japan Business Co-operation Committee's Annual Conference 2019**.

Registration Timeframe

Registration will be open from Wednesday, 5 June and close on Friday, 30 August 2019. If you are unable to complete the registration form within that timeframe, please contact the conference organisers on the details outlined below.

Registration Process

Completing the online form is a simple process and will take you approximately five minutes to complete.

As part of the submission you will be asked to upload a photo of yourself so please have one available at the time of registering. The file type should be jpg format and no larger than 1000 pixels.

When a red asterisk (*) appears next to text it means that information is a requirement and must be completed for you to continue through the form.

Once you have completed each page, please click on the yellow 'next' button located at the bottom right hand side of the screen to take you to the next page.

If you need to change information, you can go back to a previous page by clicking on the white 'back' button located at the bottom right hand side of the screen. The information you have entered will not be lost. You can also review and edit details at the end of the registration process prior to submitting.

You will be asked to confirm your AJBCC annual membership information during the registration process. If you are unsure or not currently a member you will be provided with the opportunity to nominate one of these options. You will then be contacted to confirm these details so you can complete the registration process.

Partner Attendance

HEIJO Palace (Nara City, Nara Pref.)

During most of the Nara Period (710-794), Nara served as the capital of Japan and was known as Heijo-kyo. The Heijo Palace extended about one kilometer wide and one kilometer long and served as the site of the emperor's residence and government offices. For its great historical and cultural importance, the palace site is included as one of the UNESCO World Heritage Sites of Nara.

Partners are also most welcome to attend the welcome reception and conference dinner. (Dress code is formal or business attire.)

As part of the registration process please indicate if your partner is interested in attending.

Dress code for the partner tour is casual.

If you are bringing your partner to the conference you will be asked to register their details as part of the registration process.

Keihanna Science City

Keihanna (officially known as the Kansai Science City) is nestled in the green Keihanna hills stretching over Kyoto, Osaka, and Nara prefectures in Kansai. The city, which has been constructed and maintained under the Kansai Science City Construction Act, is one of Japan's national projects - much like the Tsukuba Science City in the east of Japan. Twelve cultural and scientific research districts (about 3,600 ha) scatter the 15,000 ha of land that makes up the Keihanna Science City. It could be a good model for Western Sydney projects.

Iwatani Amagasaki Hydrogen Refuelling Station & Daikin Technology and Innovation Centre

Technology and Innovation Centre of Daikin Industries, Ltd.

The Technology and Innovation Centre of DAIKIN aims to create new value based on the world's best technologies and highly differentiated products.

Since its completion, over 31,000 researchers and engineers from domestic and foreign countries have visited the TIC. The designers are expecting that this state-of-the-art effort will lead to a reduction in environmental impact on a global scale.

Iwatani Corporation R&D Centre

Iwatani aims to realise the infrastructure of a hydrogen society using hydrogen as a way of supplying energy for the next generation. Iwatani Hydrogen Station Amagasaki, which was added to the site of the Central Research Institute, opened in July 2014. The station was the first commercial hydrogen station for fuel cell vehicles (FCVs).
